The sun has come out and school, as always, is a lovely place to be. I am full of admiration for all the children and staff at Wootton. The Year 6 children seem like they are ready to do their very best in next week's SATS tests, however it is very important to remember that SATS do not reflect the whole child. As Ms Phillips has written in her letter to Year 6 parents:

"The SATS tests do not assess what makes each of our children special and unique. The people who create these tests do not see all the other talents and skills that our children have. They do not know that some of them can speak two languages, play a musical instrument, are a skilled sportsman, or that they love to sing or draw. They do not know that their friends can count on them; how their laughter can brighten the darkest day. They do not know that they are kind, loyal and trustworthy and that every day they try their absolute best. The levels they get from these tests will tell you something, but they will not tell, you everything. There are so many ways of being smart - they are all smart! So while we are preparing for the test, in amidst of it all - remember there is no way to 'test' all of the amazing and awesome things that make you, YOU! I couldn't be prouder of all our wonderful children. '

Wise words indeed!

Across the school each class is a hive of activity. The provision in Little Gems is excellent. It was a pleasure to see the skilled staff provide such excellent learning opportunities through their high quality interactions with the children and the creative ideas they have to make learning fun. Many children loved playing word hide and seek with Jo and there was some amazing sentence writing on blocks. The progress in Opal class is excellent - there are so many children writing stories independently which are an absolute pleasure to read. Jade class love hands on maths activities, again the adults provide excellent learning opportunities and we see progress on a daily basis - even in learning about fractions which is very hard!
