She also worked with every class to create their own stained glass windows and art. Sharon Lloyd ran wonderful singing workshops for the whole school, which was so much fun. We also paired up with some of the children from the Abingdon School, where we both shared music, art and song. Mrs McNeil also ran paper craft for the whole school, making party hats or boxes. Adele showcased some of her fused glass and explained how to make it. Finally Jonathan Murr ran a workshop on how to code break Harry Potter written in Old Saxon English.
