On The Farm

Communication and Language

We will continue to increase our vocabulary by listening to longer stories, poems and non-fiction books. As well as this we will encourage the children to talk about their experiences of visiting farms using full sentences, including use of past, present and future tenses.

Maths

In maths the children will continue to deepen their understanding of numbers to 10 and will be verbally able to count beyond (20). We will also be looking at 2-D shapes and thinking about weight and capacity.




Literacy


Writing- The children will continue to write recognisable letters (Nursery and Reception) and will be encouraged to write simple phrases and sentences (Reception).


Reading-Reading books will be changed on a Monday. The children will continue to have daily RWI sessions to help them to say a sound for each letter and learn some new digraphs (special friends). We will also read high quality picture books every day and the children are able to self-select any books from the reading corner.
