Under the Sea

Communication and Language

We will continue to increase our vocabulary by listening to longer stories, poems and non-fiction books. As well as this we will encourage the children to talk about their experiences of the ocean using full sentences, including use of past, present and future tenses.

Maths

This term the children will consolidate their learning to get ready for next academic year. We will look at time, clocks, practise our numbers to 100 and create repeating patterns.

Literacy

Writing- The children will continue to write recognisable letters (Nursery and Reception) and will be encouraged to write simple phrases and sentences (Reception) to create a class book.

Reading- Reading books will be changed on a Monday. The children will continue to have daily RWI sessions to help them to say a sound for each letter and learn some new digraphs (special friends). We will also read high quality picture books every day and the children are able to self-select any books from the reading corner.

Physical Development

This term we will still have cycling on a Monday and PE will be on a Wednesday where we will continue to work on our fundamental movement skills (running, hopping, jumping, and skipping). We will also be playing ocean inspired movement games.

Expressive Art and Design

The children will continue to explore different materials and resources. We will explore paint, junk modelling and drawing. This term we will be creating an ocean shoebox diorama.



Personal & Social Development

We will think about being the best that we can be and when things go wrong how we can bounce back.

Understanding The World

We will be exploring different ocean habitats and will discuss how coral reefs form and why they are vital. Towards the end of the term, we will be learning about pollution and how this affects sea life.

RE

In RE this term, we will recognise that people have different beliefs and understand that some places are special to members of their community.

Ways to help your children:
