Get curious not furious

This week teaching assistants and teachers received training on managing behaviour. It was a helpful reminder that all behaviour is communication and showed us all that we are a knowledgeable, caring and committed staff team. One phrase I thought was very helpful was **Get curious not furious.** If, like me, you can find yourself becoming exasperated by how your child behaves at home think about why your child might be displaying that behaviour and ask them about it with and **I wonder** statement. For example: I wonder if you're feeling frustrated because you don't want to watch Peppa Pig with your little brother. You may well find this helpful as we build up towards Christmas, it can even work with grown-ups- partners, parents, in laws.....
